



LOOK UP APPLICATION LOCATIONS

Follow these step-by-step instructions to find restricted materials pesticide applications near an address or other location. These instructions are for mobile devices.

VISIT WEBSITE:

Scan QR code or visit <u>www.spraydays.cdpr.ca.gov</u> to access SprayDays California.

Use the pulldown menu at the top right of the screen to select your website language preference.

FINDING A LOCATION:

There are two ways to look up pesticide applications. You can use the "Enter a California address" field to search for applications near a specific location — such as a home address, school, place of work, business or any public address.

In addition, using the pull down menu (three horizontal bars in the top right of the main page), you can click on the "pesticide map" link which will show you an overview of planned applications around the state.



ZOOM IN AND OUT

The map will show you planned pesticide applications (numbered dots) near your selected location.

Zooming in, the number in the middle of the 1-square-mile blocks — called "sections" — will show how many restricted material pesticide applications are planned in that area. Using your mouse, or fingers on a mobile device, you can move around the map if other applications are planned near the address you identified. All application locations are shown at a 1-square-mile resolution.
